## SECRETARY'S CORNER

I made a few statements in last months Call that need to be clarified. I said that after a member has been dropped from the rolls for non-payment of dues. That he/she could be then signed in as a guest by another member. Nothing is farther from the truth. As it was pointed out to me in the Grand Lodge Statutes, once you become a member, you are considered a member for life.

Your membership can take the many forms:

1. Active member in good standing
2. Delinquent member (owing current years dues)
3. Unaffiliated member (name has been stricken from the rolls)

As a delinquent or unaffiliated member, you have no privileges at this lodge or any other lodge. Your options are to pay your dues for delinquent members or apply for reinstatement if your name has been stricken from the rolls.

An application for reinstatement can be obtained from the Secretary. After a vote on the lodge floor, you will be notified of the outcome. If affirmative, you will be required to pay a reinstatement fee of \$60.00 (\$1.00 during October & November) and your prorated dues for the rest of the lodge year.

The other thing I said was about CLMS 2 coming on line in June. Come to find out that the Grand Lodge is only allowing 10 lodges per day to transfer over. We are on a waiting list with August 5th as a tentative migration date. Till then I will still be using CLMS 1 and hoping the computer doesn't crash.

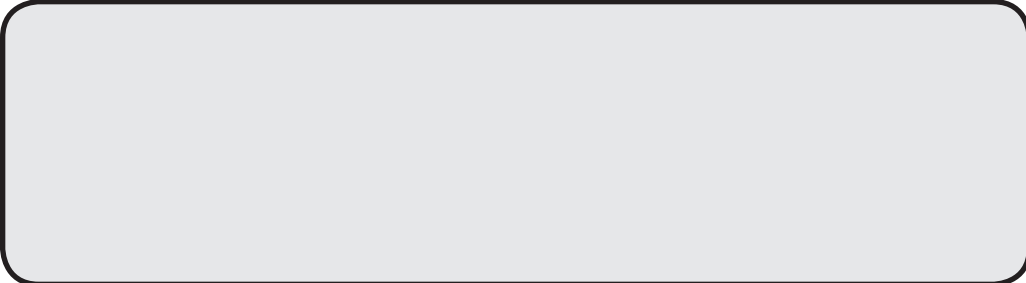
