Did you know? In 1907, the Elks became the first fraternal body to adopt by Resolution that June 14 be designated as Flag Day in our Order. President Woodrow Wilson established a National Flag Day in 1916 by presidential proclamation. In 1949, President Harry Truman, himself an Elk, signed an act of Congress designating June 14 each year as Flag Day.

Resolutions: At the 159th Grand Lodge session, members will vote on twelve state associations, and lodge proposed resolutions. A copy of these resolutions is posted on the bulletin board in the lodge as well as Elks.org. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with these resolutions. On June 13th, at our regular business meeting we will vote as a lodge on each resolution. The results of our local lodge vote will be cast at the Grand Lodge convention in July.




