Greetings fellow Elk members:

We preparing for our Flag Day Ceremony on 10 June 2018 and are anticipating that the Young Marines will carry the flags as they did last year. We are also going to have a Brunch that day at 10:30am with all the fixin's for \$5.00 per person. The official ceremony will begin at 1:00pm.

The Cinco de Mayo Celebration will be on Friday, 4 May 2018 (so we are calling it Cuatro de Mayo) and we are going to have Karaoke Night provided by our newest Elk Member, Sheri Martin.

I would sincerely like to thank all the BingoVolunteer workers that have kept it afloat. However, we are still in dire need of more volunteers for Mondays and/or Wednesdays. I think that you all are aware that Bingo is a very essential part of the financial support for the Lodge. We are contemplating the cancellation of the Wednesday session which would be a catastrophic loss to the funds for operation of the Lodge. So I am, again, asking for your help in donating a couple of hours (1100 to 1400) on Mondays and/or Wednesdays to keep our Bingo sessions on track.

Veterans' Affairs

I have been appointed the Lodge Veterans' Affairs committee chairman. In this role I hope to bring more Elks' veteran services to the Aurora community. Currently there are two other members of this committee. One is PER Art Ashley, the other is Loyal Knight Josh Flick. We can always use additional help if other Lodge members wish to join us.

After participating in the Veterans' Affairs breakout sessions at the CEA quarterlies, I became aware that there are a lot of resources available to local veterans, both from the CEA and from Grand Lodge, of which we are not taking advantage. We are not using the Freedom Grant, available from the ENF for veteran projects. We are not using the Veteran's Return to Work project resources. We are not using the Dress the Vet program, recently started in our state. There are also programs to house homeless veterans that we are not utilizing. Some of these resources require that members of our lodge take an active part in providing the aid to the veterans. I hope to get most, if not all, of these programs working in our community in the near future.

Art Ashley and myself recently were appointed as Deputy VAVS (Veteran Affairs Volunteer Services) representatives for VA facilities in the Aurora Area. Art is representative for the Fitzsimmons VA Home, and I am representative for the Jewell VA Clinic. In this capacity we are supposed to provide funding and help for those facilities.

Josh is going to work on getting the word out on Buckley AFB that we have resources available to both veterans and active duty/ANG personnel. I'd like to see us sponsor activities on the base in the near future for those working there.

We'll be contacting folks around the lodge to ask for assistance in getting the ball rolling. Please lend your support whenever possible.
